Dear Partner,

It's wonderful to get words from the Lord for you, and for Cathy and me too. These Partner Letters are like prophecies and words of knowledge for us. They come directly from God to us, and I have to tell you—every month, I get excited as I find out just *what* the Lord wants me to share. So, are you ready? Today, the Lord wants me to talk to you about *desires*.

I love our theme this year, “Great Expectation Gets Great Results.” Partner, this theme is all over the Bible because it's about having great faith and, consequently, seeing great results. So, I want to explain to you what the Lord has explained to me about the desires of the heart today.

In Mark 11:24, it says, ***“Therefore I say unto you, what things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them.”*** Notice *Who* is talking here. It's Jesus! As the Body of Christ, we must believe what Jesus said—He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life for us (John 14:6). Jesus is how we connect to the Father, and according to this verse, Jesus wants us to have our desires. He wouldn't have given instructions about it if He didn't.

Now, the Church world has a problem with your desires. God doesn't, but the religious orders of the day do. The Church world doesn't mind if God supplies your needs—they like that...as long as it isn't *too* much. But Jesus isn't anything like that! Notice that Jesus trusts you enough to say, *“what things soever ye desire.”* Religious people will hear that and say, “Yeah, but...”—but Jesus doesn't put those conjunctions on you. No, He is very simple when He says, *“what things soever ye desire.”*

Let me give you another scripture before I tell you what the Lord said to me and to you. In Psalm 37:4, it says, ***“Delight thyself also in the LORD; and He shall give thee the desires of thine heart.”***

Now, don't complicate this! Just believe exactly what the Word says. Partner, desires wouldn't be encouraged if God thought it was wrong to have them. Desires given to you by God are *not* bad things. They may be spiritual, physical, or financial, but it's likely they are all three because God wants you to be full and entire, wanting nothing (James 1:4). You can't “want nothing” unless you have all you want.

God loves us so much, Partner. He's constantly looking to be a blessing to us. Second Chronicles 16:9 tells us, ***“For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to shew Himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward Him.”*** That's what delighting in the Lord is all about. It's about putting Him first and being happy to do it.

Point one of my letter today is this: **The treasures of God are waiting for the hand of faith to draw them forth.** You see, desires come up from your heart—they rise up when you give them permission to rise. Guess what? God loves it when you let yourself be free in Him. He loves to see the desires of your heart rise up because that's the first step to receiving. You can't get what you don't acknowledge, and you can't acknowledge what you hide away, even from yourself.

God is looking to bless you—not *take* from you but *give* to you. Desire is a scary word to many Christians, and that should not be the case. Partner, I've been preaching 44 years and I find that the Church has a hard time believing this, much less receiving this truth. Jesus teaches us to expect our desires to be fulfilled, so desires are important. When you delight in God and put Him first, guess what happens? *Your* desires become *God's* desires.

Partner, if you are a good father or mother, you enjoy being a blessing to your children, right? Well, God desires to be a blessing to *you*. He wants you to see what He put in your heart. Pray, draw close, and let your heart rise—see what He's placed inside of you. Then, have great expectation about it knowing that God only wants great results for you.

Point two of my letter today is this: **Desires of the heart will give you great opportunities for your faith to work.** Partner, desires have energy—they stir your soul and stoke your imagination. They bring you excitement because they are buzzing with God's touch. Desires love to produce! Nothing God creates wants to lie dormant forever. But in order to receive anything from God, you must use your faith. Take my word on this right now—have faith and don't doubt. Your faith will work for you if you give it some work! As they say, "Faith will work if you work it!" It's so true.

A lot of people will say that your desires must only be spiritual. But if you believe that, then you are limiting God and limiting your own heart. God has no limits, Partner, and neither should you. We are made in His image and in His likeness (Genesis 1:26). So, let your desires rise up. I want you to know that God will not be upset, but rather He will be joyful that you let them rise. He'll say, "Look! They have great expectation and they will get great results." He will see them as done the moment you allow your faith to start working.

When you delight in the Lord, your desires will be filled with sunshine—that means when you live free and in faith for your desires, you shine! You glow with a great light that others can see, and because of that glow, God will get the glory. When you receive your desires, people will say, "Look at what the Lord has done!" Isn't that amazing, Partner, that God can be glorified in your desires? It's true. Always point others to Him. Every manifestation of your faith should bring God glory.

People see what I've got and ask me, "How did you get that?" I never start with the details about a thing, but I always point others to God because I know all good things come from Him.

I say, "God gave it to me! Isn't it marvelous?!"

They don't know how to respond. No matter where I am, I say, "Let's just lift our hands and praise the Lord."

They will always say, "You mean here?"

And I always say, "Why not?"

I like delighting myself in the Lord wherever I am, don't you? I have no problem giving God praise for the desires of my heart that He gave me—whether manifested yet or not, I give Him glory.

Now, point three of my letter today is this: **The truth of your desires is already in the mind and heart of God.** Before you were born, God *knew* you would delight in Him—so He planted those desires in your heart. So, Partner, write them down! Don't let them just stay in the hidden place of your heart. Go ahead and do it! Tell people what God is going to do for you. Never make an excuse for the desires of your heart. They have been placed there by God.


Rejoice and proclaim the goodness of God, the favor of God, the love of God, and the wonderfulness of God on your life. Have faith in Him for those desires to come and, I promise, He will be pleased with you!

Believe That You Receive What You DESIRE When You Pray and You Shall Have Them!

1st Week September 2020 Bible Study Notes

Open Bible Study in prayer (led by the group leader or someone they choose).

All this year, we have been continually declaring “Great Expectation Gets Great Results!”

- It is the theme that the Lord gave us for 2020 and it is all over the Bible.
- It’s about having great faith and, consequently, seeing great results.

In last month’s Bible Study, we learned to “Expect More for Your Family, Your Country, Your Job, and in Your Relationship with God!”

- We saw that Paul’s great expectation got great results during a great storm.
- We learned to never give up and expect less in life, especially when we encounter the storms of life.

***Instruct the group to turn to Mark 11:22.**

Each of these Bible Study lessons are based on words from the Lord for us in Jesse’s monthly Partner Letter.

- These wonderful messages are like prophecies and words of knowledge for us.
- They come directly from God, and it is exciting to find out just *what* the Lord wants to share with us.

Our Bible Study this month is titled: “Believe That You Receive What You DESIRE When You Pray and You Shall Have Them!”

- Today, we will focus on *desires* and see what the Lord has shown us about the desires of the heart.

***Invite someone in the group to read Mark 11:22-23 KJV:**

“And Jesus answering saith unto them, Have faith in God. For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith.”

Notice that Jesus is the one talking here.

- He was responding to Peter’s comment about a dead fig tree they noticed that morning as they were walking.

That same tree was full of leaves the day before.

- Peter remembered seeing Jesus walk up to it expecting to eat figs for breakfast.

Dakes Study Bible says that figs appear before or with the leaves, so the leaves indicated that the tree must have figs, even though the time of figs to be fully ripe was not yet come.

***Invite someone in the group to read Mark 11:12-14: KJV:**

“And on the morrow, when they were come from Bethany, He was hungry: And seeing a fig tree afar off having leaves, He came, if haply He might find any thing thereon: and when He came to it, He found nothing but leaves; for the time of figs was not yet. And Jesus answered and said unto it, No man eat fruit of thee hereafter forever. And His disciples heard it.”

When Jesus spoke to that fig tree, it had to obey His faith.

- The One Who created everything with faith-filled words had spoken.
- His disciples heard His words, saw the results, and Jesus chose this moment to teach them a lesson about how faith operates.
- Let’s look at another verse, which is our foundation text for this month.

***Invite someone in the group to read Mark 11:24 KJV:**

“Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them.”

Jesus taught them how to receive what things soever they desire:

- When you pray, believe that you receive them and you will have them.

***Group Discussion: Has this truth transformed the way you think about your desires?**

Jesus is how we connect to the Father, and according to today’s verse, Jesus wants us to have our desires.

- He wouldn’t have given us instructions about how to receive our desires if He didn’t want us to have great expectations for them.

***Instruct the group to turn to John 14:6.**

As the Body of Christ, we must believe what Jesus said to us in His Word.

Invite someone in the group to read John 14:6 KJV:

“Jesus saith unto him, I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by Me.”

- He told us that He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life for us.
- Realize today that if He is the Way, you can’t get lost; if He is the Truth, you can not be deceived; if He is the Life, the devil can’t kill you!

Now, the Church world has a problem with your desires.

- God doesn’t, but the religious orders of the day do.
- The Church world doesn’t mind if God supplies your needs—they like that...as long as it isn’t *too* much.
- But Jesus isn’t anything like that!

***Invite someone in the group to read Mark 11:24 KJV again:**

“Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them.”

***Group Discussion: Is there a “thing” that you desire, but were hesitant to pray for it in the past?**

Notice that Jesus trusts you enough to say, “*what things soever ye desire.*”

- Religious people will hear that and say, “Yeah, but...”—but Jesus doesn’t put those conjunctions on you.
- No, He is very simple when He says, “*what things soever ye desire.*”

***Invite someone in the group to read Mark 11:24 in The Message Bible:**

“That’s why I urge you to pray for absolutely everything, ranging from small to large. Include everything as you embrace this God-life, and you’ll get God’s everything.”

This translation makes it clear that Jesus wanted us to pray about everything so that we can get God’s everything.

- Listen to Jesus—He taught us to believe that we receive, when we pray, and we shall have them.

Affirmations to declare this week:

1. My Great Expectation Gets Great Results. I believe that I receive what I desire when I pray and I shall have them.
2. I believe what Jesus said—He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life for me. I connect to the Father through Jesus and receive my desires.

Close in Prayer.

Believe That You Receive What You DESIRE When You Pray and You Shall Have Them!

2nd Week September 2020 Bible Study Notes

Open Bible Study in prayer (led by the group leader or someone they choose).

Today we will continue with part two of this month's Bible Study titled: "Believe That You Receive What You DESIRE When You Pray and You Shall Have Them!"

*Instruct the group to turn to our foundation text in Mark 11:24.

This teaching is an essential element in our theme that the Lord gave us for 2020.

- Each time we declare "Great Expectation Gets Great Results," we are exercising our faith in God's promises.

Invite someone in the group to read Mark 11:24 KJV:

"Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them."

In part one of our Bible Study, we saw that Jesus was the one talking in this verse.

- He taught us an essential lesson about how faith operates.
- We are told to pray about whatever things we desire, believing that we receive them, and we will have them.

*Instruct the group to turn to Psalm 37:4.

Before we go on to see what the Lord said about our desires, we are going to look at another scripture about this subject.

*Invite someone in the group to read Psalm 37:4 KJV:

"Delight thyself also in the LORD; and He shall give thee the desires of thine heart."

Now, don't complicate this!

- Just believe exactly what the Word says.

*Group Discussion: Do you think that desires would be encouraged if God thought it was wrong to have them?

Let's look at three more scriptures about desires in the Psalms:

- Psalm 145:19 says, *"He will fulfil the desire of them that fear Him: He also will hear their cry, and will save them."*
- Psalm 21:2 says, *"Thou hast given him his heart's desire, and hast not withholden the request of his lips."*
- Psalm 145:16 says, *"Thou openest Thine hand, and satisfiest the desire of every living thing."*

Desires given to you by God are *not* bad things.

*Instruct the group to turn to James 1:4.

Your desires may be spiritual, physical, or financial.

- But it's likely they are all three because God wants you to be full and entire, wanting nothing.

*Invite someone in the group to read James 1:4 KJV:

"But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing."

You can't be in a state of *"wanting nothing"* unless you have all you want.

*Instruct the group to turn to 2 Chronicles 16:9.

God loves us so much.

- He's constantly looking to be a blessing to us.

Forget the lies of the devil that God doesn't care for you.

- Jesus tells us that we are so valuable to the Father that every hair of our head is numbered (Matthew 10:29-31).
- We, His children, are the apple of His eye (Deuteronomy 32:10).

***Invite someone in the group to read 2 Chronicles 16:9 KJV:**

"For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to shew Himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward Him."

Don't let this word "perfect" intimidate you.

- In *Vines Complete Expository Dictionary*, it is defined as "blameless, sincerity, entire; whole; complete; full"

Look at this powerful verse in the The Message Bible:

"God is always on the alert, constantly on the lookout for people who are totally committed to Him."

That's what delighting in the Lord is all about.

- It's about putting Him first and being happy to do it.

Now, listen to the first major point of this month's study: The treasures of God are waiting for the hand of faith to draw them forth.

- You see, desires come up from your heart.
- They rise up when you give them permission to rise.

***Group Discussion: Do you have a deep desire of your heart that you have not given permission to rise?**

God loves it when you let yourself be free in Him.

- He loves to see the desires of your heart rise up because that's the first step to receiving.

***Instruct the group to turn to Colossians 2:3.**

Remember that God has treasures for you that are waiting for the hand of faith to draw them forth!

***Invite someone in the group to read Colossians 2:3 (AMPC):**

"In Him all the treasures of [divine] wisdom (comprehensive insight into the ways and purposes of God) and [all the riches of spiritual] knowledge and enlightenment are stored up and lie hidden."

You can't get what you don't acknowledge.

- And you can't acknowledge what you hide away, even from yourself.
- Spend time with God in prayer and allow Him to reveal all the treasures of wisdom, knowledge, and enlightenment that are stored up and hidden for you.

Today is your opportunity to take hold of all that God has available for you.

- Don't allow them to remain stored up and hidden.
- They are waiting for the hand of faith to draw them forth.

Affirmations to declare this week:

1. I delight myself in the LORD, and He shall give me the desires of my heart.
2. My God-given spiritual, physical, and financial desires are not wrong. God wants me to be full and entire, wanting nothing.
3. The treasures of God are waiting for the hand of faith to draw them forth. God loves it when I am free in Him and receive my desires.

Close in Prayer.

Believe That You Receive What You DESIRE When You Pray and You Shall Have Them!

3rd Week September 2020 Bible Study Notes

Open Bible Study in prayer (led by the group leader or someone they choose).

Today we will continue with the third part of this month's Bible Study titled: "Believe That You Receive What You DESIRE When You Pray and You Shall Have Them!"

*Instruct the group to turn to Mark 11:24.

Every one of these weekly Bible Studies are based on a letter that Jesse writes to our ministry Partners every month.

- Each one is a message from the Lord and are like prophecies and words of knowledge for us.

They also flow with the theme that the Lord gave us for 2020: "Great Expectation Gets Great Results!"

- This principle is all over the Bible and helps us focus our faith toward seeing great results.

We will begin today's lesson by reading our foundation text for this month.

Invite someone in the group to read Mark 11:24 KJV:

"Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them."

It is clear from this verse that Jesus wants you to receive what things soever you desire:

- He said, when you pray, believe that you receive them and you will have them.

*Instruct the group to turn to Psalm 37:3-4.

In our lesson last week, we read verse 4, but today we will read verses 3 and 4 together.

- We need to know what God says about our desires and how to live a blessed life now.

*Invite someone in the group to read Psalm 37:3-4 KJV:

"Trust in the LORD, and do good; so shalt thou dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed. Delight thyself also in the LORD; and He shall give thee the desires of thine heart."

Now, don't complicate this!

- The blessing comes to you when you trust in the Lord and do good.

When you delight in God and put Him first, *your* desires become *God's* desires.

- Understand that God is looking to bless you—not *take* from you but *give* to you.

Desire is a scary word to many Christians, and that should not be the case.

- The Church has a hard time believing this, much less receiving this truth.
- Jesus taught us to expect our desires to be fulfilled, so desires are important.

*Group Discussion: If you are a good father or mother, do you enjoy being a blessing to your children?

Well, in much the same way, God desires to be a blessing to *you*, too.

- He wants you to see what He put in your heart.
- Pray, draw close, and let your heart rise—see what He's placed inside of you.

*Instruct the group to turn to Proverbs 13:12.

It is important to know that God only wants great results for you.

- You can let your heart rise and have great expectation about your desires.

Invite someone in the group to read Proverbs 13:12 KJV:

"Hope deferred maketh the heart sick: but when the desire cometh, it is a tree of life."

This verse contrasts the difference between heartbreak and heart renewal.

- When our hopes are deferred, or withheld, it makes our heart sick.
- But when the desires of our heart come to pass, we are spiritually refreshed.

Let's look at the second point of this month's study: Desires of the heart will give you great opportunities for your faith to work.

- Realize that desires have energy.
- They stir your soul and stoke your imagination.
- They bring you excitement because they are buzzing with God's touch.

Desires love to produce!

- Nothing God creates wants to lie dormant forever.
- But in order to receive anything from God, you must use your faith.

You must have faith and don't doubt.

- Your faith will work for you if you give it some work!
- As they say, "Faith will work if you work it!" It's so true.

***Instruct the group to turn to Genesis 1:26.**

A lot of people will say that your desires must only be spiritual.

- But if you believe that, then you are limiting God and limiting your own heart.

God has no limits and neither should you.

***Invite someone in the group to read Genesis 1:26 KJV:**

"And God said, Let us make man in Our image, after Our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth."

We are made in God's image and in His likeness.

- You are the manifestation of His desire.
- He gave you dominion over all the earth.

***Instruct the group to turn to 2 Peter 1:3.**

You are God's creation and have been created with His divine nature.

- So, let your desires rise up.

Realize that God will not be upset, but rather He will be joyful that you let them rise.

- He'll say, "Look! They have great expectation and they will get great results."
- He will see them as done the moment you allow your faith to start working.

***Invite someone in the group to read 2 Peter 1:3-4 KJV:**

"According as His divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him that hath called us to glory and virtue: Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust."

Affirmations to declare this week:

1. God is looking to bless me—not *take* from me but *give* to me. When I delight in God and put Him first, my desires become *God's* desires.
2. The desires of my heart are great opportunities for my faith to work. My desires have energy—they stir my soul and stoke my imagination.
3. My desires are buzzing with God's touch. I have faith and don't doubt. My faith works for me when I put it to work!

Close in Prayer.

Believe That You Receive What You DESIRE When You Pray and You Shall Have Them!

4th Week September 2020 Bible Study Notes

Open Bible Study in prayer (led by the group leader or someone they choose).

Today we will conclude this month's four-part Bible Study titled: "Believe That You Receive What You DESIRE When You Pray and You Shall Have Them!"

*Instruct the group to turn to our foundation text in Mark 11:22-24.

In this passage of Scripture, Jesus taught His disciples how to use faith and it is an essential key to our ministry's theme for this year:

- "Great Expectation Gets Great Results"

*Invite someone in the group to read Mark 11:22-24 KJV:

"And Jesus answering saith unto them, Have faith in God. For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith. Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them."

In our foundation verse for this month, Jesus gave all of us a powerful key to receiving what things soever we desire:

- When we pray, we must believe that we receive them and we will have them.

Don't let anyone talk you out of this promise from Jesus.

- He wouldn't have given you instructions about how to receive your desires if He didn't want you to have great expectations for great results.

*Instruct the group to turn to Psalm 37:4.

We read this verse in part two of this month's Bible Study, but we will look at it again in the Amplified Bible, Classic Edition.

*Invite someone in the group to read Psalm 37:4 AMPC:

"Delight yourself also in the Lord; and He will give you the desires and secret petitions of your heart."

*Group Discussion: Are there desires and secret petitions in your heart that have begun to rise as you've studied God's Word today?

When you delight in the Lord, your desires will be filled with sunshine.

- That means when you live free and in faith for your desires, you shine!
- You glow with a great light that others can see,
- And because of that glow, God will get the glory.

When you receive your desires, people will say, "Look at what the Lord has done!"

- Isn't that amazing, that God can be glorified in your desires?
- It's true. Always point others to Him.
- Every manifestation of your faith should bring God glory.

When people see what we've got, they ask, "How did you get that?"

- We never start with the details about a thing.
- We always point others to God

We know all good things come from Him.

- Have faith in Him for those desires to come and He will be pleased with you!

- We want you to know that people are being saved, healed, and blessed through your giving—and 100% of your seed goes into world evangelism.
- Each time you sow, decree and declare the 100-fold return in faith.
